1. TUITION FEES

Fees for the whole duration of the program (15 months) are:

- 3 300€ for EU/Erasmus zone students (EU countries + Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Turkey)
- 11 000€ for non EU students

A **deposit of 1000€** is to be paid before arrival to confirm admission.

Graduates from EURECOM's partner universities may benefit from a partial tuition fee waiver. List of EURECOM's partner universities. Contact admission@eurecom.fr for more information.

At the student's request, payment in several installments is possible following EURECOM's Regulations.

2. FINANCIAL SUPPORTS

INTERNSHIPS

The third semester of the program is a **6-MONTH PAID INTERNSHIP** in a company or research lab based in France or abroad. Students receive a monthly financial allowance enabling them to cover a substantial part of their costs.

PART TIME JOBS:

Even if foreign students are allowed to work part time in France, it is not advised to rely on such jobs to finance studies.

It is quite hard to find such jobs without a good grasp of French language and second the workload of the Master's program is so demanding that working part-time can seriously entail the success of the studies.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

- 1. Scholarship applications will only be processed after the corresponding application for Master's programs has been completed online and received at EURECOM's postal address.
- 2. Students need to be aware that the number of partial tuition fee waivers and scholarships is limited and that the number of applicants is high. Students should also consider other sources of funding for their future studies in case scholarships cannot be granted (scholarship from their home state, loans...)
- 3. The scholarship receiver must confirm the offer by accepting the offered study within two weeks of the scholarship notification. Without any confirmation, the scholarship will be granted to another student on the waiting list.
- 4. The scholarships (from the Labex and Fondation Télécom) and the partial tuition fee waivers are granted by separate commissions, it means that if students may apply to a scholarship and partial tuition fee waiver at the same time but they will not necessarily receive them both.
- 5. The LABEX and FONDATION TELECOM scholarships cannot be cumulated.
- 6. Scholarships decisions will not be reconsidered. It is not possible to apply to a scholarship or partial tuition fee waiver after the deadlines.

^{*}Foreign students are eligible to receive a housing grant from the French State (CAF) of an average of 150€/ month, paid after the long term visa has been validated. The duration of payment from the CAF may vary and students should not in any cases rely on this aid during the first months.
